Brushes — — suggested

Richeson Synthetic Watercolor Brush
Series 9000 **Round # 8**

Richeson Synthetic Watercolor Brush
Series 9010 **Flat Wash 1/2 inch**

(Another good brand for beginners is Princeton Neptune. There are a lot of decent brands — the main thing to look for is **#8 round** and a **1/2 inch flat**

Paint — —

Winsor & Newton Cotman Watercolor Introduction
Set of 10 5ml tubes —

(Please don't get Hobby Lobby or Michael's house brand — they will cause you great unhappiness) We have some donated paint at BRAC that you can use if you can't find the Cotman set

Paper — —

Arches Watercolor Pad
140 lb Cold Pressed 12 X 9 (12 Sheets)

(This is the most important item. Your paper doesn't have to be Arches but it needs to be at least **140 lb.**)

If you can't find 140 lb., you may buy some sheets from me)

A palette — you can actually use a flat ceramic dinner plate. The main thing is to have enough room for mixing your paints

If you buy a palette, it is good to get one with a lid — it will keep the paint from drying out, and will keep paint from spilling all over the place when you are transporting your supplies

Mijello Airtight Watercolor Palette 18 Wells — is a nice little palette

A sturdy board to tape your paper to. The board should be larger than your paper. Plexiglass, Masonite or Gatorboard will work.
