#### **RESPONSIBILITIES**

The candidate will be expected to serve on doctoral committees and supervise student research, in addition to teaching and providing service to the program, department, college, and university. Candidates are also responsible for developing a program of research and scholarly activity in the realm of school psychology.

### **QUALIFICATIONS**

Candidates for this position should have an earned doctorate from an APA-accredited and/or NASP approved doctoral program in School Psychology (or a degree program with specialization in school psychology). The program is seeking a candidate with clear expressed interest in school-psychology training, policy, and professional issues. The successful candidate will demonstrate an aptitude for conducting research, teaching and mentoring graduate students, as well as a commitment to both the Ed.S. School Psychology program and the Combined Doctoral Program in Counseling Psychology and School Psychology. We are seeking a candidate who will contribute to strengthening program quality and student recruitment, and assuring continued accreditation. The successful candidate will also demonstrate experience and evidence of quality teaching of core school psychology courses, and engagement at state and/or national levels within schoolpsychology professional associations. We are seeking candidates with evidence of strong scholarship and evidence of (or potential for) extramural research grant funding in an area that is consistent with school-psychology research. It is preferred that the candidate be licensed or license-eligible as a psychologist in Florida.

## **OTHER**

This is a nine-month, tenure earning position at the assistant professor rank, with possible summer employment. The anticipated start date for this position is 8/2019. Classified by the Carnegie Commission as a "Doctoral University: Highest Research Activity," FSU offers 341 degree programs for approximately 42,000 students and has more than 2,400 faculty, including 6 Nobel Laureates. Faculty at FSU have



garnered \$226 million in contracts and grants in 2018, and more than \$5 billion over the past five years. U.S. News and World Report ranked FSU as the 26th among 132 public universities nationally, and FSU is designated as one of only two "preeminent state universities" in the State of Florida. The FSU College of Education (COE) is listed as 46th out of all COEs in the country.
